This route offers a leisurely ride with only one significant climb at Hagbourne Hill. Around 6.5 miles are virtually traffic-free on a combination of public byways, public bridleways, public footpaths and private tracks. The remaining 4 miles are on quiet country lanes. There are numerous links to The Ridgeway and the Berkshire Downs. Surfaces vary from tarmac through tar spray and gravel chippings to limestone dust, but are designed for easy riding throughout.
